**Correction to Fetvadjiev and He (2018)**

In the article "The Longitudinal Links of Personality Traits, Values, and Well-Being and Self-Esteem: A Five-Wave Study of a Nationally Representative Sample" by Velichko H. Fetvadjiev and Jia He (*Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*, Advance online publication, November 5, 2018. <http://dx.doi.org/10.1037/pspp0000212>), the stability model is referred to incorrectly as trait-state error model in the abstract, twice in the main body of the article, and in the Table 2 Note. The fourth sentence in the abstract should appear as follows: We estimated latent state–trait models with autoregression and random-intercepts cross-lagged panel models to account for the trait-like, time-invariant stability of the constructs. In the Analysis Outline section, the first sentence should appear as follows: To assess the longitudinal stability of traits and values, we used the latent state–trait model with autoregression (Steyer & Schmitt, 1994). In the Analysis Outline section, the second sentence should appear as follows: To assess cross-lagged effects, we used an adaptation of the random-intercepts cross-lagged panel model (RI-CLPM; Hamaker, Kuiper, & Grasman, 2015). The first sentence of the Table 2 Note should appear as follows: Stability coefficients are from univariate latent state–trait models with autoregression, computed separately for each trait and each value (Figure 1, paths *a*). The Kenny & Zautra (1995) reference has been deleted from the text and References list, and Steyer & Schmitt (1994) was added to the text and References list.
